Art	Paint at the easel Group holiday mural	Expressing creativity; developing fine motor skills; Applying new knowledge
Tech	Ipads	Turn taking; developing hand-eye coordination and fine motor skills; practicing various cognitive skills (literacy, math, science concepts)
Science	Jingle bells and Magnatiles	Exploring cause and effect; making observations; turn taking with peers
